

LAY SERVANT MINISTRIES

Called by God to Serve

The United Methodist Church has established three categories for laypersons in the area of lay servant ministries to develop, prepare, and engage principled Christian leaders for the mission of making disciples for the transformation of the world:

- Certified Lay Servant
- Certified Lay Speaker
- Certified Lay Minister

Certified lay servants who wish to develop their skills further may choose a track to become certified as lay speakers (those who are called specifically to pulpit supply) or as lay ministers (those who are called to long-term, intentional ministry as part of a ministry team).

Certified Lay Servant

A certified lay servant serves the local church or charge (and/or beyond) and:

- provides program leadership, assistance, and support.
- leads meetings for prayer, training, study, and discussion.
- conducts, or assists in conducting, services of worship, preaches the Word, or gives addresses.
- provides congregational and community leadership and fosters caring ministries.
- assists in the distribution of the elements of Holy Communion.
- teaches the Scriptures, doctrine, organization, and ministries of The United Methodist Church.

Certified Lay Speaker

A certified lay speaker serves by preaching the Word when requested by the pastor, district superintendent, or committee on lay servant ministries in accordance and compliance with ¶341.1 of *The Book of Discipline*.

The role of a certified lay speaker is a specific calling for the ministry of pulpit supply.

Certified Lay Minister

A **certified lay minister** serves as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergyperson and:

- conducts public worship.
- · cares for the congregation.
- develops new faith communities.
- · preaches the Word.
- leads small groups.
- · establishes outreach ministries.
- serves as a class leader.
- assists in program leadership.
- engages in specialized ministries after appropriate training such as in parish nursing, church planting, men's ministry, children's faith formation, congregational care, and more.

CERTIFIED LAY SERVANT

Serves the local church or charge (and/or beyond) and:

- Provides program leadership, assistance, and support
- Leads meetings for prayer, training, study, and discussion
- Conducts, or assists in conducting, services of worship, preaches the Word, or gives addresses
- Provides congregational and community leadership and fosters caring ministries
- Assists in the distribution of the elements of Holy Communion
- Teaches the Scriptures, doctrine, organization, and ministries of The United Methodist Church.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION:

- Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation
- . Lay Servant Ministries BASIC course
- Lay Servant Ministries advanced course
- District committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure (See ¶668.3) approval

REQUIREMENTS FOR RENEWAL:

- Annual report & renewal application
- Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation
- Lay Servant Ministries advanced course in the last three years
- District committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure (See ¶668.3) approval

CERTIFIED LAY SPEAKER

Serves by preaching the Word when requested by the pastor, district superintendent, or committee on Lay Servant Ministries, in accordance and compliance with ¶341.1.

CERTIFIED LAY MINISTER

As part of a ministry team with supervision and support of a clergyperson:

- · Conducts public worship
- · Cares for the congregation
- · Develops new faith communities
- Preaches the Word
- · Leads small groups
- · Establishes outreach ministries
- Serves as a class leader
- Engages in specialized ministries after appropriate training such as in parish nursing and church planting
- · Assists in program leadership

REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION:

- Certified as a lay servant (or equivalent as defined by his or her central conference)
- Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation
- Completion of a track of study as defined in ¶267.3.c.
- Conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval after interview with and recommendation from the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries

REQUIREMENTS FOR RENEWAL:

- Annual report & renewal application
- Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation
- Lay Servant Ministries advanced course in the last three years
- Conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval every three years after interview with and recommendation from the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries

REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION:

- Certified as a lay servant, lay missioner (or equivalent as defined by his or her central conference)
- Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation
- Completion of a track of study as defined in ¶268
- District Superintendent recommendation
- · Appropriate screening & assessment
- Conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval after interview with and recommendation from district committee on Ordained Ministry

REQUIREMENTS FOR RENEWAL:

- Annual report
- Pastor and church council or charge conference recommendation
- Ministry review
- Lay Servant Ministries advanced course or approved continuing education event annually
- District Superintendent recommendation
- Conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries approval every two years after interview with and recommendation from district committee on Ordained Ministry

Lay Servant Ministries Basic Course

Where to begin: Introduction to Lay Ministry - The BASIC Course

This course is foundational for all courses in Lay Servant Ministries. Participants are encouraged to discover and employ personal spiritual gifts as God intended and to consider the importance of exercising servant leadership, developing future leaders, remaining rooted in consistent spiritual practices, and being part of a group that holds members accountable in their discipleship. The course focuses on Caring, Communicating and Leading effectively. There is a Youth Addendum available for The BASIC Course.



Certified Lay Servant / Lay Speaker Process

LAY SERVANT

Certification: participation supported by pastor, complete Basic and 1 Advanced course. Submit **Lay Servant** Annual Report/<u>Initial Certification request</u> for approval at Charge Conference

Renewal/Recertification: take at least one (1) Advanced class every 3 years Each year, submit Lay Servant Annual Report at Charge Conference

LAY SPEAKER

Certification: participation supported by pastor and church council, complete the LSM Basic and specific Advanced LSM courses in 6 subjects: discovering spiritual gifts, leading worship, leading prayer, preaching, UM heritage and polity. Submit Lay Speaker Initial Certification Request to Charge/Church Conference, final approval from the LSM Conference Board (composed of all the District LSM Directors)

Renewal/ Recertification: take at least one (1) Advanced class every 3 years. Each year submit Lay Speaker Annual Report at Charge Conference.



Certified Lay Minister Process

Certification: is a Certified Lay Servant (Certified Lay Missioner) with written recommendation of the local pastor, who completes the Spiritual Gifts Advanced class, along with the 4 CLM Training Modules with an approved instructor or pastor.

Module 1: <u>Call and Covenant for Ministry</u>, Module 2: <u>Practice of Ministry</u>, Module 3: <u>Organization for Ministry</u>, Module 4: <u>Connection for Ministry</u>.

In addition to the **Certified Lay Minister** Annual Report/<u>Initial Certification Request form</u>, an application package must be submitted followed by an interview with the DCOM. CLMs receive final credential approval from the LSM Conference Board (made up of all the District Directors) following the District DCOM's approval recommendation.

Renewal/ Recertification: CLMs must submit a CLM Annual Report for the yearly Charge Conference in their church; Must complete at least one (1) Advanced LSM course approved for CLM renewal continuing education every 2 years. Submit a Bi-annual report to the district DCOM including a written assessment by the District Superintendent showing satisfactory CLM performance.

Certified Lay Servants, Lay Speakers, and Lay Ministers must retain the copies of their earned training certificates.
